Description			
<i>Provide a short description of the event and its activities.</i>			
The exhibition presents the diverse history of European Jewish women in the 20th century through their life stories from Germany, Poland, Greece, Spain, Hungary, Slovakia, and the Czech Republic.			

Seven European Jewish women, seven personal life stories.

These stories delve into experiences of persecution, deportation, and escape, but also depict survival and the process of rebuilding life after World War II and the Holocaust. Exploring the exhibition offers insights into growing up in a Jewish family before the war, reminiscing about loves, school experiences, everyday hopes, and struggles.

The exhibition opening event was held in Csányi5 - Jewish Local History Collection of Erzsébetváros on May 9th where 77 people attended.

The event started with opening remarks by Maria Lieberman, the director of Centropa Hungary, followed by welcome speeches by András Heisler, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Erzsébetváros Jewish Heritage Foundation and Péter Niedermüller, Mayor of Erzsébetváros district. They spoke about the importance of having such an exhibition 80 years after the Holocaust in Hungary.

After the opening, Maria Lieberman led a discussion with Vera Szekeres-Varsa, the Hungarian participant of the exhibition.

The exhibition is open for public and for school classes' visits until May 31st and then from June 7 till September 30.
